## Harbourmaster's Report

**T**he gate went in April 8, and water levels are not abnormally high. We may be able to get sailing early. Launch will definitely be May 6 for Crimson Cove, and May 7 for the rest of the harbour.

The volunteer Spring Work Party is scheduled for May 14 and 15, a bit late but there's no other weekend that could work. I would like some assistance with the gas dock rebuild before then. We are prepared to start things there as of this writing. New cap for the wall; re-lay part of the patio, and get the wishing well working are the tasks to complete before launch if we can. All assistance welcomed.

Thinking of launch, please dispose of chemicals, old batteries, etc., in a safe way. If you're in doubt, talk to the yard staff for assistance. Cradles should be folded right away so they can be stored.

On launch day itself, please keep clear of boats being launched and don't install messenger lines until all boats are launched. We'll be using traffic cones to designate areas

where launching will happen. Crew chiefs are: Crimson Cove, Denny Foy; the point and Emerald Cay, Jim Johnson; Mauve Cove, Roger Woeller; and the eastern side, Kirk Robertson. Remember to be at your boat when it is launched, and make sure your mooring fees are paid.

To keep you up on staffing, I have already had productive meetings with our new manager, Paul Moore. He is a welcome addition. We have Scott Secord returning from university to work in the yard alongside Andrew Furey. Our co-op student, Chris Thompson, is working out very well and plans are for him to assume gas dock duties when his placement ends.

A huge thank you to Ron MacIsaac for his work on restoring power to the east yard; John Vines for his diligent work on the crane repair; Dave Little for his assistance on the gas dock rebuild.

Kevin Kubusheskie (Dalriada) has assumed responsibility for being the Club Safety Officer. As he's also a member of the Coast Guard Auxiliary, he can check your boat and issue a compliance card. Welcome and thanks to Kevin.

Keep Sunday afternoon, **May 1, free from 3:30** on. There'll be an **information meeting for all boat owners**, followed by a launch crew briefing. We'd like to hear what's on your mind, and clarify ideas that have been put forward at the SGM of April 20.

It's a busy time of year, with many jobs to do to get the Club ready for the sailing season.

Please use service request forms to let us know what needs doing. Mooring requests and changes also need a paper trail. We have about 25 moorings vacant at the moment.

That's it for me for now.

We have continued to receive scheduled membership and mooring fees so our cash flow is healthy. Please be advised that mooring fees must be paid before launch or your boat will not be launched!


The Special General Meeting on April 20 was a very successful meeting in which presentations and discussions were held regarding motions:


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HELP!







## To all Member Handicappers & Owners,

On Saturday April 2, 2005, Central Council passed a motion to change the maximum penalties for the Genoa and Spinnaker, **effective January 1, 2006.**

The maximum allowable luff perpendicular without penalty on a genoa will be 155% of J. Currently 153%.

The maximum allowable mid-girth without penalty on a spinnaker will be 180%. It is currently 183%.

*Any spinnaker built before **January 1, 2006** is grandfathered for the life of the sail.*

Intrinsic in this motion is the understanding that all spinnaker and genoa penalty parameters will be adjusted accordingly.

Attached is a copy of the new tables that will be inserted into the Handicappers Manual for 2006.

### CHANGES TO JIB MAXIMUM PENALTY – EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2006

#### 7. ADJUSTMENTS TO SP HANDICAPS

##### 7.1 JIB (GENOA)

7.1.1 The boat is handicapped on its largest jib or upwind staysail. The ratio to LP/J shall be calculated and expressed as a percentage. LP% (refer to table 7.1.2)

7.1.2 Jib Handicap Adjustments are tabulated as follows:
