

## HARBOUR REPORT

As we are emerging from a more traditional Canadian winter we begin to think of the upcoming season and launch. I wish to thank Peter Holton for his diligence in providing snow removal from the parking lot and yard, it is appreciated by all who use the facilities.

At haul-out last fall, Andrew inquired of all members present their spring intentions with respect to launch. Andrew then placed the vessels in accordance with the information supplied by the respective member. Members are requested to contact the office and

book a launch date and time conducive to their schedule.

In September the south crane ramp was filled with gravel and the yard crew yielded increased maneuverability for the tractor and hydraulic trailer. We will be looking at paving this area after the gravel has sufficiently settled.

An attempt to drain the harbour to facilitate repair of the inner harbour passage and east wall was thwarted by the rising fall water. In preparation for the repairs the east drain passage was opened and the sluice logs removed to drain the basin. The main harbor gate was installed and for a couple of days the water receded until the fall draining of the upper water shed resulted in a significant rise of water levels. Another attempt at this repair is anticipated for the fall of 2013.

A tentative date of May 4 is set for the mobile crane launch, and the office will be accepting bookings for the stationary crane for spring launch pending Andrew's schedule.

and approved by the Board in the very near future. We'll have slightly over \$100k to work with this year on new projects, with \$90k already in the Baird study of erosion of the progress for the Harbour wall, the Bob Ross motor, Junior boats, Furnaces and lakeside boundary. A very impressive list considering a zero percent increase to Mooring fees and a minor increase to Membership fees.

You will be reading about new initiatives by the Property and Tax Committee leading to (hopefully) a reduction in Property Taxes and perhaps even the lease fees with the NCC. Other economies in such areas as VISA Card charges are also forecast thanks to more members using direct payment banking to pay their annual membership dues as well as their monthly invoices – there is a potential there for the Club to save over \$25,000 a year in fees.

Looking forward, operating activities appear to be getting organized in regattas, parties, weddings, etc. at a pace close to last year. Our General Manager, Paul Moore, has also been booking non-member events into 2014 and a couple even in 2015. BYC's reputation for quality service, great food and reasonable prices is becoming very well known in the Ottawa Area, and we are using that business to hold all charges to our membership steady at current rates.



### House & Grounds Report

**I**n the past year we had several projects as we prepared the clubhouse and grounds for the 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary - most notably the

restoration of the west wall, related items, and work on the gardens and around the flagpole. This year we have no project with the scope of the west wall project however there are a few smaller items we will be addressing – replacement of the carpeting in the Upper Deck and on the outside staircase, staining of the balcony, repair of the steps to the bridge and some work on the trophy cases to name a few.

Every year there is much to be done; cleaning, planting, painting, etc. to prepare our club for "the season" and to repair and improve our aging facilities. I am compiling a list of items to be addressed. If you note something that needs attention, please advise me or the Manager so it will go on the list. I am looking for new individuals to serve on the House and Grounds Committee. Many of you do not wish to attend meetings (kept at a minimum) but are willing to help – just let me know.

If you have an interest in the gardening, please contact Jane Agnew who leads the garden group.

Your patience is appreciated as some the issues are addressed as often the "fix" is not easy or we may be waiting for the appropriate person (e.g.: electrician) to address the issue.

I look forward to your support and participation during the year.

5. Submitted a written application before the cut-off date of April 30, 2013.

### **Applications will be judged on:**

1. Previous sailing experience;
2. Demonstrated excellence in competitive sailing and;
3. A sail training development program outline for the award year, which should include plans to attend several major regattas outside of the Ottawa area.

All applications **MUST BE** accompanied by the development program to which the applicant is prepared to commit their effort.

Successful applicants will be required to provide the Trustees with a written outline of their training and racing activities at the end of the 2013 racing season.

Last year there were a number of protests and an appeal arising from marks that had moved. Suffice to say it would have been and will be easier to make sure the marks don't move (or least get replaced quickly) than to deal with after affects. You can see all appeals on the Ontario Sailing website ([https://www.ontariosailing.ca/Racing/Appeals\\_History.php](https://www.ontariosailing.ca/Racing/Appeals_History.php)).

On May 3 & 4, Ontario Sailing will be running a Mark Set Course at BYC run by John Weakley. (You can register at <https://www.ontariosailing.ca/application/index.php?action=member.formList>.)

The course is meant for people with some mark set experience, and is designed to help you set marks to the most exacting standards. There will be a portion of the

course on the water - gate or no gate. It will be early May so dress appropriately. Register early, as the numbers will be kept small to ensure everyone gets on-the-water experience.

You should already have taken a Race Management Course. It will be well worthwhile to download and read the CYA race management manual <http://www.sailing.ca/files/officials/RMM09Complete.pdf>. You might want to print some of the forms and tables. The cost for the course is \$55.00.

Some of the things you might want to bring along:

- ▶ a chartplotter
- ▶ handbearing Compass
- ▶ range finder ( we will have at least one there)
- ▶ VHF radio
- ▶ squared paper pad & pencils
- ▶ life jacket for Saturday.

Boats, marks, pumps and flags etc. will be supplied by BYC and lunch will be available. More on the course as the date gets closer.



## UP- RIVER RACING SPRING 2013

**T**he following are the BYC special events and upriver races scheduled through to the Commodore's Sailpast in the middle of June. All are fun races, although they may appear competitive until we are all holding drinks back at the bar.

Note that it is necessary for boats to have valid PHRF certificates and for skippers and crew to register for the season's racing. There is a small annual fee for the PHRF certificate and renewal. Best to register at the Sailors Meeting in April.

May 20<sup>th</sup> Monday - **Shorey Race** - A race designed for sailors who are ready early in the season and who like either to overnight on the May long weekend or to rise very early on a Spring morning. The race starts at mid-day upriver, on the far side of Constance Bay, and returns the fleet to Britannia. Note that the course includes rounding "E" Mark.

May 26<sup>th</sup> Sunday - **Jefferson Pursuit** - The Jefferson Pursuit Trophy is for the first boat to complete the course, the boats being started according to their PHRF rating - the fastest starting last. This is a fun race open to all. A change for 2013 is to have at least one other race from "S" Mark, a mass start and scored from corrected time, following a course around the permanent marks.

June 1<sup>st</sup> Saturday - **Spring 50-mile** - A favourite long-distance race under high sun and on one of the long days of the year. The start is at 8.00 in the morning. The multi-leg course includes Mohr Island, where there is likely to be plenty of water early in the season. Don't count on swimming this early.

June 9<sup>th</sup> Sunday - **Pinhey's Point** - A popular pocket-sized long-distance race with a comfortable 11.00 am start and expected finish in good time for cocktails at the Club.

June 16<sup>th</sup> Sunday - **Commodore's Sailpast** - Maybe less competitive than the races.

From April 7<sup>th</sup> the NSC **Ottawa River Challenge** is open - sail as fast as you can any time you choose from "S" Mark to K16 at Mohr Island and return to "S" Mark. Report the times to NSC. According to some past results it does not take long - the River may really be shorter than it seems to most of us.
